Residents Call for Full Environmental Review of Proposed Concrete Batch Plant on Route 9

Clifton Park/Halfmoon, NY — Residents for Responsible Development (RRD) is speaking with Spectrum News regarding community concerns about the proposed concrete batch plant at 1910 Route 9.

The proposed industrial facility would operate along a busy commercial corridor near residential neighborhoods and within the Dwaas Kill watershed. Residents have raised concerns regarding:

- Fine particulate (PM) emissions
- Water usage and watershed impacts
- Impacts to nearby homes and businesses
- Heavy truck traffic and roadway safety
- Cross-municipal oversight between Clifton Park and Halfmoon

RRD supports responsible development but is calling for a thorough and transparent environmental review under SEQRA before approvals are considered .

“Our goal is not to stop development of projects needing cement,” said Jason Moyer of RRD. “but we know that a concrete plant in this location is wrong. We want to ensure that any heavy industrial proposal undergoes a full environmental review so residents understand the impacts to air quality, water sources, public health, sensitive environmental areas, traffic, and property values.”
